Pastor's Pen

February 14th, sometimes called Valentine's Day, but this year called Ash Wednesday, is almost here. Because Ash Wednesday starts the Lenten season, the preparatory season for Easter Day, I wanted to do my duty as a pastor and remind everyone of why we observe both Ash Wednesday and Lent. In short, we are remembering Jesus fasting and praying in the desert for 40 days after his baptism before He began His public ministry. The Scriptures tell us that while in the desert, Christ was tempted by Satan, but prevailed against him. After this period of fasting, struggle, and prayer, Christ emerged from the desert strong enough to start what only He could finish.

Lent is a serious time in the life of the Church because, for the faithful, the season builds up to the remembrance that Christ conquered sin and death. However, I find that sometimes I overcomplicate Lent. With that in mind, I want to offer some simple reminders for Lent 2018. We focus on three areas: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

1. Prayer. This doesn't have to be hard. Assess your prayer life. If your prayer life is non-existent commit to something small during Lent. You cannot go from "I pray every now and then" to "I'll pray for an hour a day." It is not going to happen. If you have been struggling in the prayer area then get a devotional that is not too long and use it every day.

For those that are doing well in their prayer life, but want to continue to grow then I have a new tip for you this year: spend 10 minutes in silence waiting on God to speak. It might sound simple, but it is far from it.

2. Fasting. Remember, fasting is not a weight-loss plan, it's a God-gain plan. People have given up a whole host of things over the years, but all you have to do is simply remove something you like from your diet and do not pick it up again until Easter morning.

Sometimes people "fast from some part of their life" like television, video games or golf, but again, I'd encourage you to keep it simple. Fast from a food or drink and if you are watching too much TV and playing too much golf, just cut back on it because Lent is not about making new habits, it is about growing in relationship with God.

3. Almsgiving. This is the giving of money/possessions. I have heard of people fasting from their favorite drink or food and using the money they would have spent on those things to charity. That is certainly a good option. Another option is to purge your house of things that you don't need so you can give it to people and places that do need those things. Then just don't buy anything big during Lent and give the money to causes you want to.

Again, keep this easy. Deciding how to pray, fast, and give should not be where we put our energy. Instead, our energy should be put on preparing our hearts during this Lenten season.



Jesus invites us to take part in the special meal he ate with his disciples the night before his crucifixion, and other meals he shared in homes and on hillsides.

MUMC observes Holy Communion the first Sunday of each month, each week during the Wednesday Evening Communion Service, Ash Wednesday, Easter and Christmas Eve. During Holy Communion, it is common practice for the worshipers to come forward to receive Communion and kneel at the chancel railing for a time of prayer.

The money left at the railing during Holy Communion is used throughout the year to help provide a variety of assistance to those in need of help during stressful times of their lives.

Ms. Pam and Ms. Kristi talked with the children about Psalms 51 explaining that God forgives us for our sins if we pray and makes us white as snow.








Preschool
