The event was held in the MUMC Gym where over 25 tables were set for over 115 guests. A Passover Seder plate containing six items was placed in the center of each table for the special Seder dinner. Each of the six items arranged on the center plate of the tables had special significance to the retelling of the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt.



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Each year we look forward to baking Resurrection Rolls the Wednesday before Easter! It's a creative way to tell the story of Jesus's burial and resurrection. Here's the recipe and the story our Children's Director tells while assembling the rolls. Enjoy and have fun celebrating the truth that our Savior is risen!

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

2 cans of Crescent rolls, 16 large marshmallows, ½ cup melted butter, ¼ cup granulated sugar, 2 tablespoon cinnamon

Jesus is God's son who was sent to earth to pay the price for our sin. He never sinned. The white of this marshmallow represents the purity and sin-free nature of Christ.

After Jesus died his body was prepared for burial. After he was buried, his friends prepared him to be buried with oil and spices. Dip the marshmallow in butter, then in sugar and cinnamon.

Jesus was wrapped in linen and placed in a tomb with a large rock rolled in front. Wrap the marshmallow in one triangle of dough covering it completely like a ball (rock).

Complete the process for all 16 triangles and marshmallows. Place in the oven for 10-12 minutes.

Allow rolls to cool. Say after 3 days, his friends went to visit the tomb but the rock was rolled away and two angels said, "why are you looking for the living among the dead?"

Reveal that when you cut open a roll or take a bite that the marshmallow has disappeared, leaving an empty "tomb."

Remind children that the rolls are sweet just like the love God has for us.
