## Pastor's Pen

#### Getting a Ride

I will never forget my first 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend in New England. Being the place where the United States started, the amount and types of celebrations are numerous and varied. There are revolutionary war reenactments at Lexington and Concord, a huge concert (broadcast nationwide) from the esplanade near the Charles River, and numerous "BBQs" around every street and neighborhood. In many respects, there is a feeling of the revolution and the founding fathers being closer, somehow feeling more patriotic.

Our first fourth of July had passed without a hitch and I was getting ready to return to Asbury Grove where I was the Chaplain at a summer camp meeting community. I arrived at the train station, eagerly awaiting my train for my carefully timed route from Franklin to Boston and then to Hamilton. All told, it normally took me a couple of hours when I timed it right. However, the normal 7:52am train did not arrive. I waited a few minutes, but then it hit me: this was Monday after the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Early trains were not running. At that moment I went into a panic. I had an afternoon full of responsibilities and expectations. What was I going to do?

At that moment, as I was pondering my next steps, I caught sight of a "commuter friend". He was headed to his car. I quickly ran over to him and asked if he would mind if I rode with him into town. He graciously said yes, and we sped off to Boston. Thanks to his kindness and help, I was able to make it in time.

In telling this story, I call you to remember the last week of our "Back to Basics" sermon series: *Service*. Think honestly and openly: when was the last time you gave of yourself and expected nothing in return?

Did you help lead a small group study?

Did you volunteer with our kids or youth?

Did you help pack food for our Backpack program?

Did you give someone a ride to the doctor?

Did you act kindly when you wanted to be angry?

Did you act in a way that loved the person rather than judging them?

These are very important questions when we consider how we live out our faith in service. As we go through September, we will be on a "Journey with Jesus", looking at the people and places Jesus encountered on his many trips throughout Judea. Each of these trips will call us to be aware of how we act, speak, and care for people around us. How are we serving our community in love this fall?

The MUMC Backpack Project reached 100 children during last year's school year, and the project extended over the summer delivering to 50 families every other week. We hope to have a list of children for this school year within the next couple of weeks and are hoping to make our first delivery on September 12.
