

Hope for the Holidays 2018

Hope for the Holidays has become an annual event and main project for the MUMC youth. The event started in 2006 and has continued to expand since that time. Our youth group is extremely involved with this event; however, it would not be possible without the assistance of many volunteers. Preparation for this project takes year round planning starting with donations of soaps and shampoos from our congregation collected from hotels while vacationing. Without the donations from these trips, the health kit project would not be possible. Thanks everyone!!

Our families are provided through the counselors at the Marion School District and the adoption process starts in November of each year. This year the project took on 85 families. For the families not adopted, we have individuals who shop in bulk to fulfill those needs and made easier by toy donations during November and December. The gift collecting and assortment is an enormous task starting with the youth shopping and finalized with persons donating gifts for those families that do not get adopted.

The volume of food needed to make this event a success is astronomical. In order to raise awareness and encourage donations, bags are placed in the narthex with a list of requested food items with announcements during worship and in the newsletter. After all food donations have been received, Harvest Partners stepped in to fulfill any additional needs to complete the project.

The event is successful because of the generosity of a loving and caring congregation. Donations range from money to provide funds to purchase necessary items, time dedicated for the many needs throughout the month, a chili supper with cinnamon rolls during the Marion Christmas Parade, cook book sales. All proceeds go toward the Hope for Holidays project.

On the morning of December 24th, the MUMC sanctuary was filled with volunteers sharing in a

devotional by Tim Parker. Following the devotional, volunteers received instructions on how pick up and deliveries take place. Volunteers assisted with loading of vehicles, with food, gifts, checking bags against delivery sheet or whatever necessary. The youth group would like to take this opportunity to THANK ALL who participated to make Hope for the Holidays another success.

Looking for the Vision of God

For years I was the only one in my family who needed no vision correction. My parents and both brothers have horrible eyesight. My wife needs contacts as well. I'm sure at some point we will find ourselves in the optometrist office for David, Emma, or Samuel. But for years, I took pride in the fact I didn't need glasses or contacts. In 2012, however, after three years in graduate

school staring at small print in books and on computer screens, my eyes finally gave in. I went to the eye doctor and learned that while I did not need glasses for everyday activity, I would indeed need them for reading and screen activity.

At this revelation, I did what people do: I went into denial. I tried to just limit my time of deep eye concentration. I made things bigger print when available. I increased the font on my phone. But alas, the reality set in: I needed to wear my reading glasses. Most days at the church office you will find me in my office with my glasses on. If not, know that I pay a price later in the day or evening with a horrible headache. It is such a simple fix, and yet I often still find myself being reluctant to use my glasses. I know the benefits. I know the consequences. Somehow, I still refuse to believe that my glasses are in my best interest. Why?

In church we often try to do things on our own. We try to do worship on our own. We try to serve our community on our own. We try to read and study scripture on our own. We try to make disciples on our own. Sometimes we are even mildly successful at doing this. Yet, just like me without my reading glasses, when we try to do it our own we fall short of what we can do or be. We grow tired easily and burn out. We struggle to keep up and stay relevant in a rapidly changing world. Just like when we take off our glasses, when we try to do things without inviting the presence of God, we cannot see the whole picture of opportunities that lay before us.

In January a new group will begin meeting at Marion United Methodist Church. This new Vision Team will meet weekly for prayer and discussion as we begin the process of looking for the vision of God here in our midst. This team will seek to ask the hard questions within our church and congregation including:

Where are we making disciples?

Where are we not being faithful?

How are we fulfilling our call as a congregation?

Where are we afraid?

What are we trying to do on our own without God?

How can we seek God's vision for the future of our congregation?

This process will be ongoing and evolving, helping us to ask God's guidance and see where the holy Spirit is leading. The Vision Team will give regular updates to the Church Council and the Congregation and will help set goals for our congregation in the coming years.

To help in this process, I ask that every family in the church, whether you are a family of 1, 10, or somewhere in between, pray the following prayer together each day.

Eternal God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon Marion United Methodist Church, the Marion community, and its people. Help us to see where you are leading. Help us to share in the vision you have for our congregation and community. Help each and everyone of us to be part of the making of disciples.

In the name of Jesus, the holy one of God, we pray. Amen.

God has been moving! God is moving! God will continue to move! Let us join together in seeing the vision of God for our congregation, our community, and each other here at Marion United Methodist Church in 2019.
