The Frustration of a Cliffhanger

My children do not know the annoyance and frustration of a TV cliffhanger episode. The benefit of internet television services is that when Emma wants to see a certain episode of Mickey Mouse Clubhouse or David a certain episode of PJ Masks, I generally can find it without having to pay additional monies or subscribing to a new service. Netflix, Amazon, Disney NOW, PS Vue...these have all added convenience to what used to be a frustrating missed episode and most annoyingly: the cliffhanger.

I remember as a kid always watching Star Trek: The Next Generation with my dad. Every week we would sit down and watch Captain Picard and the crew of the Enterprise venture across our television screen. Then, to my childhood horror, there was the inevitable cliffhanger. Captain Picard had been taken by the Borg and the Enterprise prepared their super weapon and then the terrible words: to be continued. The next three months passed with cruel slowness as we waited for the premier episode. And remember, if you missed the premier it would be months before you could see it again. We just had to wait...and wait...and wait...

There are numerous critiques about modern society and our reliance on technology, but our shift from patience to instant gratification is one of the most profound changes in our society. Even something as simple as a TV cliffhanger seems to not quite have the impact as before. When we begin talking about our faith, how we trust in Jesus, and what it means to share the love of God, we fall into the trap again. We want instant gratification, instant results, instant response. Yet God reminds us over and again throughout scripture that there are seasons of waiting. Moses and the people wait in the wilderness. Jesus and the disciples wait to enter Jerusalem. Paul waits to be healed following his conversion. We all still wait for the final reign of God in this world.

On January 16th fourteen 6th graders from our congregation began a journey of waiting. Through April they will be learning more about faith, the church, God, and how their commitment to Jesus' call matters. It is not an easy or simple process and yet they undertake it just as many of you did, to see where God is leading. Right now, they are between episodes, waiting for what will be revealed through the Holy Spirit. It is a constant continuation and is one that demands waiting. As our confirmands continue this journey, they need your prayers. Hold them in your hearts, that God may reveal new things to them, and they may take the next steps of faith.
