How Time Passes

I remember as a kid, about seven or eight years old, really understanding for the first time the nature of the calendar and the passing of days. It was the beginning of a school year and we were going over our calendar. I had known the days of the weeks and the months of the year for a while, but in that moment, it finally hit as to how long and short certain time periods were. On that September day, I realized that Christmas was (shock) over three months away! How was I ever going to wait that long. The last day of school? That was still 170 school days away. My birthday...nearly a year. My childhood struggle to understand how time could pass so slowly.

Flash forward nearly thirty years and I struggle to slow time down. Just the other day a picture appeared on my Facebook memories of David playing with a turtle when he wasn't quite two years old. I honestly wondered, "Where has the time gone?" Could that really be four years ago? Is it possible that much time has passed?

May 18th marked one year since we closed on our house here in Marion. June 10th is the day we moved to Marion. June 24th was the day Tom Letchworth prayed for my family and I before his sudden and untimely passing. Then there is July 1, the day I joined in officially in worship and preaching for the first time. Has it almost been a year? Has time passed that quickly? The answer, amazingly enough, is yes.

Over the last year we have had many transitions and changes. We have updated our Sanctuary with new sound, video, and lighting. We have updated floors throughout our children's area. We have given our historical Pastor photos a new place of memory in our church. We said goodbye to Tim Parker as our Youth Director but welcomed Kolby Jones only to our staff. Our Children's Ministry had an amazing year with 75 children registered for our Wednesday WWF program. The New Mission team is already putting together our first projects for the coming year. Our Vision team has been meeting to help identify goals and priorities for our congregation and will be presenting those to you as a church very soon. Our Church Leadership meets weekly for prayer and discussion as we too seek to discern God's direction for our congregation. All of this and so much more! Most importantly, however, we have worshipped, prayed, sung, celebrated, grieved, and sought God together.

I love being here in Marion and I look forward to seeing where God leads us in ministry and service to our community. As we come to this anniversary, I will be holding a *"Church-Wide Town Hall" meeting on Sunday morning, June 30th at 9:30am in the Family Life Center*. I will be leading this town hall in conjunction with church leadership as we answer both your questions, receive feedback, and take an intentional time of prayer for our congregation. Please come to this special time of discussion as we as a community begin our second year together.


