## Pastor's Pen

## The Worst Thanksgiving Ever...But Not Really

2005 was a hard holiday season for my family. Over that previous Summer, my maternal grandmother had received some very difficult diagnoses regarding her health. While treatment initially worked, the cancer quickly returned, and it became clear she was going to die. The next few months were filled with last visits, last conversations, and last moments until that day arrived in November when she died. It was the Tuesday before Thanksgiving.

For us this was particularly difficult as Thanksgiving had always been a holiday we spent with my mother's family. Nanny would cook the spread of a lifetime every year:

Turkev

Ham

Dressing

Purple hull peas

Greens

Cornbread

And much more...

On Wednesday after her death, we ventured to Atlanta for the funeral, with a large pan of "chicken and dressing" from a family friend. We wouldn't be able to have a traditional meal, but we could still eat together. However, late that night the meal disagreed with me and I found myself very sick for the next 36 hours. While the rest of the family went ahead down to Athens to prepare for the service, I honestly wondered if I would make the funeral at all. Luckily, by Saturday morning I was fit enough to go and we arrived in time for the service. A couple of hours later, we were on our way home.

At the time, I half-jokingly said it was our "worst thanksgiving ever". And by nearly every traditional metric, it had been horrible. Yet, as the years have passed, I have a certain fondness for that thanksgiving week. It was, to this point, the last time the whole family was together on my mother's side. We remembered the person who had given us so many reasons to be thankful for many Thanksgivings before. Even despite illness, travel, and a fair bit of chaos, I remember this Thanksgiving for the time we spent as a family, remembering our loved one.

Give thanks. Say it. Do it. Mean it. It matters. You do not know what you may not get the chance to do again. This Thanksgiving, open your heart and give thanks.

## Chili Recipe for Dec. 12th

We need help cooking chili for the upcoming annual youth fundraiser to be held before and during the Marion Christmas Parade. All proceeds from the event will go towards the Hope for the Holidays program. For those interested in cooking, please use the recipe below, package in ziploc bags, freeze and deliver to the church office or to Kolby Jones.

#### CHILI RECIPE:

- 2 lb. ground beef
- 4 (15 oz.) cans dices tomatoes
- 2 (15 oz.) cans kidney beans, drained
- 2 small white onion, diced (12 oz bag frozen onions)
- 2 Tbsp. chili powder
- 3 teaspoons of garlic salt
- 2 (15 oz.) cans of tomato sauce
- 4 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon oregano

In a large stockpot, cook ground beef over medium-high heat until brown, stirring frequently. Add remaining ingredients and stir to combine. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to medium-low, cover and simmer for 15 minutes or until the onion is cooked and softened.

## **Thanksgiving Meals**

The holidays are a unique time of the year which allows us to reach out to others in many ways and display the love of Christ to a watching world. Thanksgiving in particular is a great time to show gratitude for our good fortune by giving to those who are less fortunate. This year our youth will once again prepare and deliver plate lunches to approximately 100 elderly individuals.

Each year, the youth work with the Arkansas Council on Aging to seek out individuals who, without our assistance, would not enjoy a typical Thanksgiving meal. Our youth will meet on Wednesday, November 27th at 5:00 pm to begin preparation of the food to be delivered the following day. On Thanksgiving day, the youth and volunteers will warm food, prepare plates and deliver the meals to all the individuals on the list by noon.
