

Mission Work Heart of the Matter



By 1:00pm that day, we as a congregation packed over 20,000 meals to help feed the hungry. Backs were tired, legs and arms sore, but the spirit was moving. What an amazing blessing! Stopping in the Park

When I was in seminary, I rode public transit, most notably the subway (called the T in Boston) and commuter train, basically every day. While it isn't for everyone, I mostly enjoyed my experience. It was a productive time when I could read, study, make pastoral calls, or just relax. But on warm spring days, rather than taking the T to South Station to catch my train, I would make the 45-minute or so walk from Boston University up through Commonwealth Avenue, and arrive at the Public Garden on Boston Common. There, I would take the rare moment to just stop. I would often buy a water or tea and just relax in the park, for even just a few minutes, to hear the birds and let the business of the day drift off behind me.

In the years following, I have found those opportunities growing rarer as our family has expanded, and the busyness of church has replaced the business of seminary. But still, on a warm day in the Spring I find myself longing for those few precious minutes when it seemed as those the world stopped and let me catch my breath. There are places and times I find those moments. Sometimes, even just walking in the zoo as the kids run up ahead to the next exhibit can give me a glimpse of those moments. What is hard to acknowledge, however, is the moment to find that breath and pause, we must make intentional time. We must take the time, set it aside in our schedules and obligations, to just pause and reflect.

Between the overwhelming force that is the Christmas season and the outburst of joy that is the Easter story, we often limp along spiritually. We don't take the time to renew our walk. We let our prayer life, our worship, and our scripture reading slide. We just feel too busy to make it all happen. Then Lent arrives.

We have entered the Lenten season. This is our deep breath and pause in the park. This is our warm day in which we can take a breath from all our busyness to prepare for the next steps in our walk with Jesus. We know that there is still more to do, more on the horizon, even difficult things ahead, but we pause here. Perhaps you have given something up to help you refocus on the things of God. Or maybe you find yourself like me: just needing a breath. What if this Lenten season you took five, or ten, or even thirty minutes a day to just exist? To just be. To simply rest and watch the world around you.

Take a breath. Pause. Let your soul and body relax. There is more ahead and Jesus is calling us to get ready.
