

# From Church to Chaplain

The hardest day of the last year, and there have been many in 2020, was October 5<sup>th</sup>. On that day, the news became official and public: I will be leaving Marion United Methodist Church in January of 2021 to become a Chaplain in the United States Army. Even typing those words recalls the rush of emotions from the various text messages, phone calls, emails, and visits I have received from you all following this announcement. I will admit to being overwhelmed by your support and positive response. This was a long fraught decision, that pushed Priscilla and I in our understanding of God's call. We are excited, nervous, and curious as to what this change will mean for us and our family.

In preparing for this change, I keep looking at one of the tenants of Army Chaplaincy: ministry of presence. To be present with soldiers while at home, in the field, and while deployed is the ministry of the chaplain. This change of call has made me look at the nature of ministry within our local churches, including here in Marion. How are we involved in ministry of presence with others?

Let us name a couple of things first: presence does not always lead to transformation and presence does not always mean a reciprocal relationship. Jesus encountered many people on his journeys, some were already Jewish, others were Gentile, some were healed, some followed, others did not. Yet, Jesus and the disciples encountered them none the less. Later, in the Great Commission in Matthew and Luke-Acts, Jesus commands the disciples to go forth into all the world. The nature of ministry in the gospels is always one of solidarity and presence. That presence stands beside persons throughout the best and worth of life. There, in those moments, we can offer love and support.

Marion United Methodist Church sits in a unique location here in our community. We have the possibility to grow in presence within our community, to be with people both in their time of need and when things are going well. If there is any lesson that 2020 has taught us, it is that ministry can look different from one moment to the next. As we enter a new time of transition, I would encourage us to pray and seek a new way to be present in our community and to those we serve.
