

I Need Christmas This Year

I am well known in my family, my friend groups, and clergy circles for being a bit of a Scrooge during the Christmas season. I am not totally sure how it happened. My best guess is that after years of working in Church, particularly when I was on the music side of ministry, the simple joys of the season were replaced by "work". This is a common issue for us clergy and church employee folk, particularly with the ever-expanding footprint of the "Christmas season", now stretching seemingly from mid-Oct to about Noon on Christmas day.

There are ways in which I try to fight against it. I hold the kids off on Christmas movies and specials until at least after Thanksgiving, if not December 1st. I try to plan worship to focus on Advent and "waiting". Priscilla graciously indulges me, and we hold off on putting up our Christmas tree until the last few days before Christmas. It then stays up until Epiphany on January 6th. And I will admit that most years this does give me some relief, as well as a Scroogie reputation. Yet, as 2020 grinds to an end, I realize that this year I need Christmas. Now.

Part of the reason why Christmas is such a powerful holiday and holy day is that the entire focus is upon deliverance. That deliverance and salvation was long awaited by the Israelite people. The prophets of the Hebrew Bible foretold that God's deliverance would come. A savior, a prince of peace, one who would change the world, would be born to save the people from their oppressor and their sin. The people of the Hebrew Bible waited some 600 years for that prophesy to be realized. Even then, Jesus defied the expectations of the people, who sought a warrior king, and instead lived out a life of love and grace. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, the reality of God's love is made manifest, redeeming the world.

This year has tried all our patience and has looked like no other year in living memory. We need something to look forward to and set our minds upon. The promise of the Christ child shares a new hope in the world. We receive a promise that rather than being bound in our current place, we are set free in something greater. This year I look forward to Christmas, not just the day, but the whole season. The hope, joy, peace, and love that can abound even during a pandemic. I pray you too are looking forward to Christmas. This year do not simply wait but embrace the promise that is to come. From someone who would normally urge you to hold off, be patient, wait for Christmas...this year I boldly say to you: Merry Christmas! Christ is coming, and indeed is already here, sharing hope and grace with a hurting a broken world.

Service is Returning During Advent:

Our Wednesday Night Communion service will return during Advent. Dates for the service are: December 2nd, 9th, and 16th. The service will be at 5:30pm and will be in the sanctuary. The service will be approximately 30 minutes in length and Communion will be served.

Pastor Andrew will also offer drive-thru communion from 6:10pm until 6:30pm on those nights. To receive drive thru communion, please pull under the portico on the main parking lot from Hwy. 77 to avoid traffic picking up to go food.

Our kitchen crew has graciously agreed to provide meals for the 2nd and the 9th. Those meals will be to-go only, available immediately following the end of service. The cost will be \$7.00 and can be picked up under the Gym Entrance Canopy. Menu for each is as follows:

December 9th: Lasagna, salad, bread and dessert
