# Hope for the Holidays

We were able to return to our normal schedule after a year of challenges. This event is successful because of the generosity of a loving and caring congregation. Our youth are extremely involved with this event; however, it would not be possible without the assistance of many volunteers.

Preparation for this project takes year-round planning, starting with donations of soaps and shampoos from our congregation collected while vacationing.

Each year, we work with counselors at the Marion School District for adopting families. This year, the project took on 74 families and reached nearly 300 children. Our congregation adopted 49 families, the youth group adopted 2 families and the remaining families are funded through donations made directly towards the mission. Karen Jones took on the task of shopping for the unadopted families for a total of 125 children. Her shopping is greatly enhanced by those who make toy donations during November and December.

The volume of food needed to make this event a success is astronomical. The Marion School District took up collections and donated over 4000 canned items. The two schools who collected were Herbert Carter Global Community and the Marion Junior High School. Fogleman Farms continues to support this mission by purchasing all perishable food items.

On the morning of December 24th, the MUMC sanctuary was filled with volunteers sharing in a devotional by Kolby Jones. Afterwards volunteers received instructions on how pick up and deliveries take place. Volunteers assisted with loading of vehicles with food and gifts. The youth group would like to take this opportunity to THANK ALL who participated to make Hope for the Holidays another success.

The Sunday following Christmas Eve delivers, we were pleasantly surprised by a visiting family. Once we began talking with our guests, we learned that they were the recipients of gifts and food distributed on Christmas Eve morning. They came to learn more about our church and give thanks for all that they received from the Hope for the Holidays mission.
