## Pastor's Pen

You may have heard about all of the "one anothers" in the Bible. There are supposedly 59 "one another" verses in the Scriptures. I haven't counted. A quick survey, though, yields phrases like "love one another," "honor one another," "accept one another," "teach one another," "serve one another," "forgive one another," "encourage one another." These are all phrases having to do with communal life.

I think such "one another" language is increasingly important in our society. We live in a culture that places a high value on concepts like independence and autonomy. Our thinking is more and more dominated by "me" and "I" thoughts and opinions. I don't know that we can really change that, but we can, at least, hold it in balance with what the Bible says. If we're going to do that, however, we have to adjust *how* we read the Bible.

You see, there's a problem when it comes to translating the Bible into modern English. We have no way of expressing the plural "you." (Okay ... in the south we have "y'all" but I can't see Bible translators using that any time soon). The King James Version had the advantage of using Thee/Thou/Thy/Thine for singular and Ye/You/Your/Yours for the plural. Modern English, however, has no such distinction.

As a result, when we read the Bible, we typically read all those "yous" as singular and think God is addressing us with personal individual instructions. Certainly our individual practices are important, but they are incomplete.

The Bible always assumes a communal context. We are designed to live in relationship with one another. We are supposed to consider one another.

If you think about the spiritual life in "one another" terms the whole thing becomes apparent. We are not self-sufficient creatures. Left to ourselves we grow weak. Left to our own opinions we get led astray. But if we are going to live in community we have to listen to one another and we can borrow strength from one another. So get out there and get to "one anothering" one another.


