Pastor's Pen

"Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers." (Romans 12: 9-13)

The New Revised Standard version places the verses above under the subject of "The Marks of the True Christian." Subject headings rarely catch my attention but this one did. It's powerful, and somewhat convicting, to think that the Christian life should bear some distinctive marks. Our faith should produce evidence that we follow Jesus.

The quick and commanding phrases in this passage offer us some goals for the Christian life. According to Paul, the true Christian is marked by overwhelming

love, passionate service, and extreme generosity. These attributes are to be integrated into the grit and grind of our daily life. They are to be manifested in the way we work, talk, and treat others.

John Wesley, too, believed that Methodist Christians in particular should bear certain distinctive marks that define life. Steve Harper wrote a book called *Five Marks of a Methodist* that was based on one of Wesley's sermons. Harper breaks Wesley's advice down into five phrases. A Methodist:

- 1. Loves God
- 2. Rejoices in God
- 3. Gives Thanks
- 4. Prays Constantly
- 5. Loves Others

That's a short, easily memorable guide for life.

Further, Wesley also gave us the General Rules as a helpful guide for living life. In short form, the General Rules are:

- 1. Do no harm
- 2. Do good to others
- 3. Stay in love with God by attending to the Means of Grace

All of these sets of rules complement the others. They all suggest basically the same kind of life.

Perhaps it would be a good exercise to spend a few weeks meditating on each of the rules above. Take a phrase per day from Paul's list for the next 13 days. Then take 8 days to consider the Wesleyan rules for life. If we spend time prayerfully working these characteristics into our everyday life I think we might be surprised at how different our lives look in 21 days.
