## Pastor Bill

We've once again experienced all that the holiest of weeks in the Christian year has to offer our souls. We waved our palm branches and shouted "Hosanna!" We sat with Jesus and the disciples in the Upper Room where we broke bread together. We followed him to Golgotha's hill and wept with Mary as he died. But then our hearts rejoiced as we found the stone rolled away from the tomb and heard an angel announce "He is not here! He is risen!"

Okay ... so Easter is over ... Now what? What comes next?

It's interesting to read about what the disciples did after Easter morning. Some of them went fishing. Two of them decided to take a walk together. Thomas decided to take a nap or something. In other words, they went back to life as usual.

Or, at least they tried.

What the disciples discovered when they went back to life as usual was that everything had changed. The normal wasn't so normal anymore because Jesus kept showing up! When they went fishing they met him on the beach cooking breakfast. As they walked along the road together Jesus suddenly appeared next to them and enlightened their conversation. All that ordinary, mundane activity was transformed by the presence of the risen One.

Our Easter celebration is over - but guess what? Jesus can and will continue to show up in your life every day. Prayer Stations
Our youth are preparing Prayer Stations for Holy Week. They will be located in the Matt Sample Youth Building. Stations will include:

- "Wide Awake" Scrabble-There will be letters spelling Wide Awake and you are asked to add words you feel need praying over, whether that is a person, feeling, animal, etc.
- Yarn Wooden Cross- Multiple yarn colors will be provided to put on a wooden cross; each color represents a different thing to focus on and pray over.
- Sticky Note Prayers-Sticky notes will be provided for you to write anything or anyone you want to pray for or just something that is on your mind.
- Prayer Link/Chain-There will be slips of paper at this station for you to write something you want to pray for, so you can staple it to the ring left before you (Making a chain).
- Chalk and Zen Boards - We will have Zen and chalkboards for you to write things on your mind and give yourself the chance to let them go.
- Labyrinth-Labyrinths are a great method of praying and letting things go. We have placed a life-size labyrinth at this station.
- Name Tree-We have leaves laid out and a canvas with a stump on it. At this station you will be given the opportunity to pray for others.

Everyone is encouraged to drop by following services during Holy Week and participate in this event put together by our youth.
