

# Pastor's Pen

Travel back in time with me for a moment to first century, Judea. We are standing in a crowd gathered around a rabbi named Jesus. Suddenly, we hear him say "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Matthew 16:24).

Such a statement would hardly come to us as comforting news. In the ancient world, the cross was meant to make a public statement: Rise up against Rome or commit a crime and this too can be your fate. No one wanted to end up on a cross, let alone willingly take one up and start walking. So, what did Jesus mean when He said, "Take up your cross and follow me?"

I don't think Jesus was referring to the trials and tribulations we often encounter in the daily grind of life. Taking up the cross is not about dealing with chronic health problems, or


misbehaving kids, or difficult coworkers. Certainly these are issues of great concern and we can bring them to Jesus and ask for his help, but they don't define what Jesus meant by taking up the cross as a disciple. I don't think we can say, "That's the cross I have to carry."

In Jesus' day, the cross wasn't a shiny piece of jewelry or a topper for the church steeple. It was an instrument of humiliation, suffering, and death. For us as Christians, we look to the cross primarily as the source of our redemption but it is also a call to follow Jesus in the same manner. When Jesus said, "Take up your cross and follow Me," it was in the context of following Him, regardless of the cost to our personal lives.

The good news, however, is that if we are following Jesus to the cross then we can be certain that crucifixion is not the end, there's something more that follows —

resurrection! We die to our own ambitions, pride, opinions, attitudes, and habits in order to follow Jesus into the new life that he promises. This new habit of dying to self is still exceedingly difficult — the old self never gives up the fight to live — but Jesus does remind us, that "whoever desires to save his life will lose it. but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it" (Matthew 16:25). It can be a scary thing to follow Jesus to the cross, to give up control, and let go of the only life I've ever known. But we also have the promise that He will lead us into a new way of life that truly honors God, self, and others.
