Pastor's Pen

"I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." (Ephesians 4:1-3, NKJV)

I've always loved the words above from Paul to the church in Ephesus. His emphasis on the theological oneness of the church is inspiring "One Lord, one faith, one baptism." The apostle's repetition is like a Holy Ghost hammer on the soul of the church. You are all one in Christ Jesus!

It's fairly easy to agree that where a group of people is *united*, they are probably going to experience a lot less friction than if they were *divided*. Part of the problem is that it's also easy to slip into some misunderstandings about what it means to be united. We sometimes confuse unity with uniformity or homogeneity.

Unity – at least Christian unity – is not the same as either uniformity or homogeneity. In other words, unity is not every person agreeing with every other person about everything. Unfortunately, we live in a culture that tries to stress such uniformity of thought and opinion.

Christians, however, are not necessarily united by a common ideology, but by our relationships. We have a common relationship with God our Father. We share a

common relationship with Christ as our Savior. We are all baptized into a common family called the church. We work toward a common mission of reaching out to others who feel far from the love of God and drawing them near to Christ. Faith in Jesus Christ is what unites us.

What makes for a united congregation? It is our family bonds, our relational bonds that make us one. This kind of unity is not a result of any cultural, political, or worldly opinion. Our unity is created by the Holy Spirit.

Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love; the fellowship of kindred minds is like to that above.



Love and Faith in action. MUMC immediately pulled together to cook and provide a meal to the community in Wynne within 48 hours of the destruction from an E5 tornado on March 31st. Our church also collected a long list of items such as hygiene products, air mattresses, clothing items, school supplies, batteries, etc., filling a 14 foot trailer within a week of the disaster. Our church family spent Holy Thursday cooking BBQ for sandwiches, then on Good Friday a large group of our MUMC family, loaded with supplies and another meal, headed to Wynne and spent the afternoon serving those in Ward 4 of Wynne, the area hit hardest by the tornado. Thank you to everyone who cooked, shopped for the items needed, helped load, drove to Wynne to serve meals and those to made financial contributions to help make this possible.

















MISSION OF HOPE—Feeding Children of Haiti



The volunteers ate pizza and cookies before taking on the task of packaging the meals. Thank you to all who helped make this a success. A special thank you goes out to Beverly Vaughn for all that she does, including phone calls and organizing all our mission projects.





The Mission of Hope program currently feeds over 125,000 kids every day through about 500 partner schools around the country of Haiti. These meals have the ability to bring kids from level 3 starvation into full health.
