

CHANGE IS COMING

Can you feel it yet? Fall is almost here.

College students have been delivered to their dorms or apartments. The first signs of Halloween are in every store, with a smattering of Thanksgiving and Christmastoo-early also to be found.

So how was your summer? Was it graced with periods of rest? Did you spend time on the road or at the beach with family and The anonymous preacher (traditionally thought to be when you heard the birds singing you awake in the morning? The anonymous preacher Solomon) who wrote the book of Ecclesiastes reminds us that the changes in the weather are not the only seasons we experience in life. In fact, he reminds us that "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens" (Ecclesiastes 3:1). Solomon gives several examples of the constantly turning seasons of life: times of weeping and rejoicing, times of war and peace, times of building and tearing down, times of giving and times of saving.

At the end of his list of seasons in Ecclesiastes 3, Solomon says that God makes everything beautiful in its own time. Because of that, the preacher recommends that the best thing for humankind in whatever we do in any season is to be joyful, "do good" as long as we live, and take pleasure in our toil or work, whatever it is. He says that this is God's gift to

man. In other words, God is in control so enjoy yourselves! Isn't that kind of a fun thought?!

Sometimes changes in our life don't seem so fun. By nature, we don't always like change. If that's you, remember that God is in control, no matter the season. He's good to you, and He'll take care of you, so enjoy whatever God has in store for your next season of life!



MISSIONS: The MSD Backpack Program is well underway this school year.

The office staff along with Dana Robbins are shopping for the needed food items. We have volunteers to help stock the shelves, fill the bags and deliver to all Marion School District schools. We are delivering bags weekly to HCGC, MST, VPA and the Jr. High School. The bags delivered each week total 80 between the schools.

In addition, we stocked a pantry at the 7th grade building

and one at the Sr. high school.

Items stocked were duplicates of items as provided in the weekly backpacks, but also includes canned vegetables, etc., at the high school. The 7th grade and Sr. High pantry program began last year and was a success. The pantries allow food to be distributed on an individual, as needed, basis. This allows more discretion for the older students. The counselors monitor the supplies and contact the church office when food is needed. So far, we have stocked both schools three times as of the end of September.



Food items that are included in the weekly bag are: pop tarts, nutrigrain bars, cereal, canned pasta, Mac and cheese, Vienna sausages, ramen noodles, and a variety of snacks.

Thank you to all the volunteers who help stock, bag and deliver items each week. This program provides a much needed outreach to the children in our community. If you would like to make a donation towards purchasing of food items, please note so on your check, and the funds will go towards future purchases. Great Job MMC!!!
